Summer is here – How dare I wear this bathing suit?

Modern humans must constantly struggle against our biologic imperatives. There is a strong evolutionary reason for packing on extra pounds during our winter hibernation as a safeguard against the long winter nights and inconsistent food availability. Alas, we are hardwired to store fat in times of plenty so that we can survive in food scarce times. This was done of course, before we knew anything about “super-sizing our fries” and before the invention of video games, computers, and television remote controls. These neat labor saving devices allow us to remain in a sedentary trance for hours, if not days on end. These twin forces have contributed to the epidemic of overweight people in our country. Americans spend 50 billion dollars a year as a result of the consequences of being overweight.

But let's cut to the chase - now that summer is here how to fit into our bathing suit? The most common

weight loss program is based on behavior modification techniques. Whatever diet is chosen: Adkins, American Heart Association, South Beach, Subway sandwich, they all involve a conscious decision to change eating behaviors. They all work to varying degrees, but the crucial element is attrition. Although we can certainly change eating behaviors we tend to slide back to what was comfortable and easy, the new behaviors may become extinguished over time. Programs like TOPS and Weight Watchers offer the benefits of structure and group support for weight loss and reinforce the positive changes of a healthier eating style.

Another important consideration is regular exercise. Exercise alone will not consistently lead to weight loss, but combined with changes in dietary habits will speed the process along. As a bonus, exercise has its own cornucopia of health benefits.

Medications for weight loss are available, but not widely used

because of frequent side effects, modest activity, and high cost. This is an area of tremendous research effort and it seems inevitable that given the pace of medical progress that in the future we will have safe and very effective medications to control our body weight.

But until then, choose a diet and stick to it, get a buddy to provide support, exercise, limit portion size, and don't supersize those fries.

It's more than just "what I saw" ... it's "where I went!" I spent a few days last week in Savannah, Georgia.

I could not have picked a better time to visit the area, because the weather was perfect for being outside and taking in the sights. I stayed at a hotel on Bay St., which is the main street running through Savannah's historic district. One block over is the road that travels along the river's edge, named—logically enough—River Street (my, how our forefathers were insightful!). This cobble-stoned street is lined with shops and restaurants. Getting to it is something of a trick, however. From Bay St., You have to go down three flights of stairs to get to River St., as the street is down by the river, while the rest of Savannah is 20 feet higher. It's sort of like they built the shops into the side of a cliff.

Everything on River St. has such a wonderful, turn-of-the-century feel to it - you can even still see the rails that the trolley cars used to run on. It all reminded me very much of Boston, except that it's much safer to walk here

without all the Boston drivers – and walking is what it's all about. Everything is within walking distance in the historic district. And if you don't feel like walking, there are guided motor tours as well - including a 'ghost tour' that carts you around in the back of a hearse. I skipped that one – the only time I want to be in the back of a hearse is when I am on my back (make whatever you wish out of that statement).

I stopped in to River St.'s only gay bar, "Chuck's", and was surprised as just how friendly the locals are. I also visited the other gay clubs in town over the next couple days. There are five total in the area, including Club One Jefferson - definitely a "video bar" if there ever was one; Chuck's, the gay-friendly local hang-out with a view of the Savannah River; and Face's, which is located inside an old historic building with wood floors and low ceilings – and a pee-trough in the men's room ... YUCK! There is also Blaine's, which has a new, crisp feel to both the bar and its patrons, and Felcia's, which I did not visit but was only told "it has a very interesting crowd". I never figured

out what that meant.

The lesbian/gay mixture definitely swung more towards the women. I saw more proud lesbian couples out shopping and sightseeing during the day- more than I saw gay men out in the clubs at night. But mostly I was there to enjoy the daytime sights, and that's what I did. I saw quite a few statues around town, and stopped to read the information plaques at most of them. Those plaques are everywhere, including the historic buildings – and each of them tells a short, interesting historical story. I'm something of a history buff, so this was perfect for me.

My favorite statue is the "Waving Lady" on River Street. It's a life-size monument dedicated to this woman from the 1800's who used to welcome all the ships as they passed through Savannah (my kind of gal, eh?). I'm living in the wrong century – 100 years ago I would have been sainted for all the happiness I brought into the lives of lonely sailors.

Unfortunately, my hotel was NOT located adjacent to the port (damn the luck!), but rather, right next door to a nightclub called "Club One Jefferson", and it happens to be where the famous Lady Chablis performs. As a matter of fact, it seems that a large chunk of Savannah's tourist dollars are based on the "Midnight in the Garden of Good & Evil" book (and later, movie – starring Lady Chablis as herself). I even found a store dedicated entirely to that book.

My favorite store is called "Urban Cargo". It's on Whitaker St., and it is about the gay-friendliest place in this entire gay-friendly city. The owner Dan is very funny and quite easy on the eyes (as the saying goes). I stopped in a couple times each day - I think he finally got the hint when I kept going in and buying postage stamps...one at a time. The store is something like a gay "Pier 1 Imports" (even more gayer than they already are!), but they also carry cards, candles, small furniture, jewelry, and t-shirts.

Since Savannah is about four hours away (it's about 300 miles – all of it on I-95), it makes a perfect long weekend getaway. Reasonable hotel rates with large rooms, traveling convenience, historic sights, and the gay-friendly atmosphere all make it an
