# DOCTALK

## THE COMMON COLD AND FLU:

Hello all! As we all are aware the cold and flu season is upon us. The old adage “an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure” is true for the common cold as well as the majority of other conditions afflicting health. I hope everyone finds this article informative and useful for a healthier and happier new year.

Prevention involves maintaining and strengthening the immune system and doing your best to avoid infection. We all know the simple things: make sure to wash your hands frequently, try to avoid touching your face after shaking

hands and one you may not have heard: use air kisses when greeting your friends and relatives. Nothing passes a virus around quicker than lip to lip contact. All you need is a quick touch of the lips with one person and you’ve got an excellent chance of catching whatever’s going around.

Here is one of the recommendations that my office uses for the common cold.

**TREATMENT SUMMARY:** This treatment protocol is focused on the use of natural methods to assist the body in recovering from the common cold and flu.

### RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Rest (bed rest is best)
2. Drink large amounts of fluids diluted vegetable juices, soups and herb teas
3. Limit simple sugar consumption including fruit sugars
4. Vitamin C with bioflavonoids 500mg four to six times per day
5. Vitamin A 25,000 to 50,000IU per day
6. Beta-carotene 50,000 to 100,000IU per day
7. Echinacea 250mg three times daily.

**WARNING:** Do not follow this recommendation of vitamin A if you are pregnant or a sexually active woman not employing effective birth control.

### SPECIAL FORMULA:

This protocol will relieve cold and flu symptoms within hours in six to eight cases. It must be employed at the onset

of symptoms. At the first signs ( I must be coming down with something ) take 500mg vitamin C/bioflavonoids every fifteen minutes for four hours. Follow with one tablet hourly for two or three days. Take 100,000 to 200,000IU of vitamin A/Beta-carotene daily for one week (see **WARNING** above). Drink a large amount of fluids.

If you are aware that you have a cold in most cases the effects are limited to three or four days.

**SPECIAL NOTE** Drinking a lot of orange juice during a cold does more harm than good because of the much higher level of sugar than vitamin C.

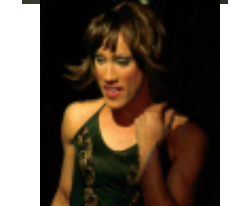
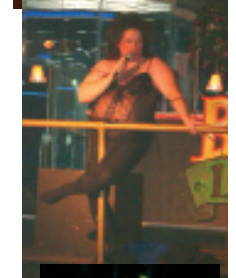

Will we have Social Security when we retire? Will our 401(k) grow enough to allow us to have a decent retirement? Will our IRA's survive economic difficulties?

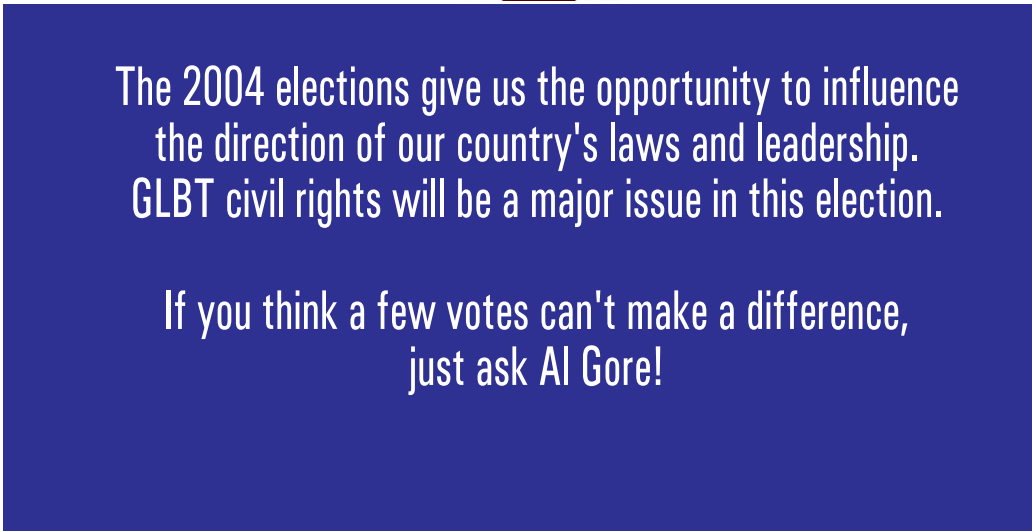

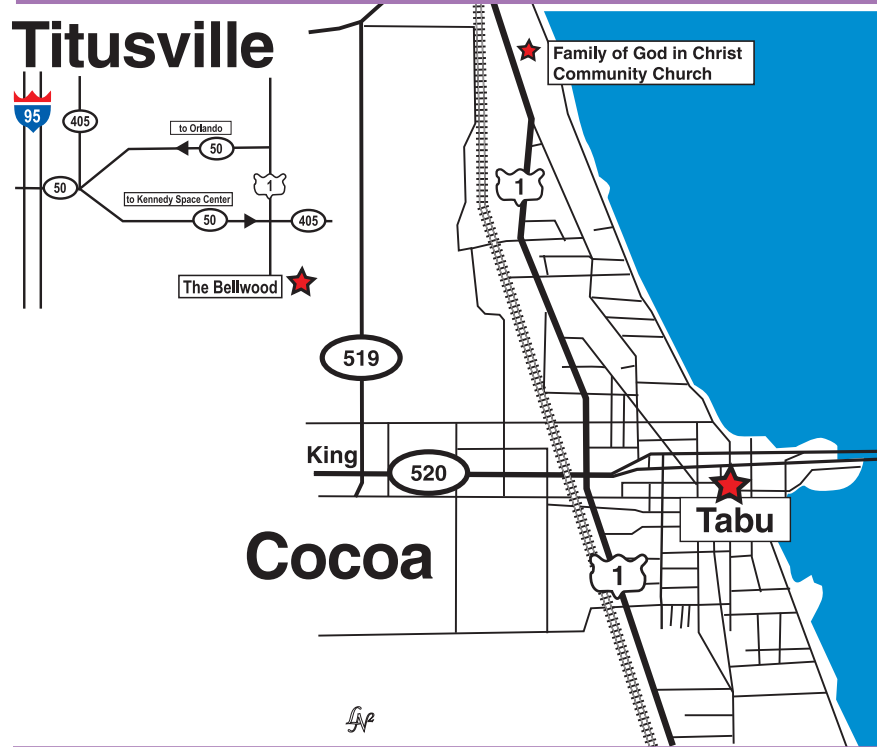

May your new year be full of joy and peace and child-like living. ▼

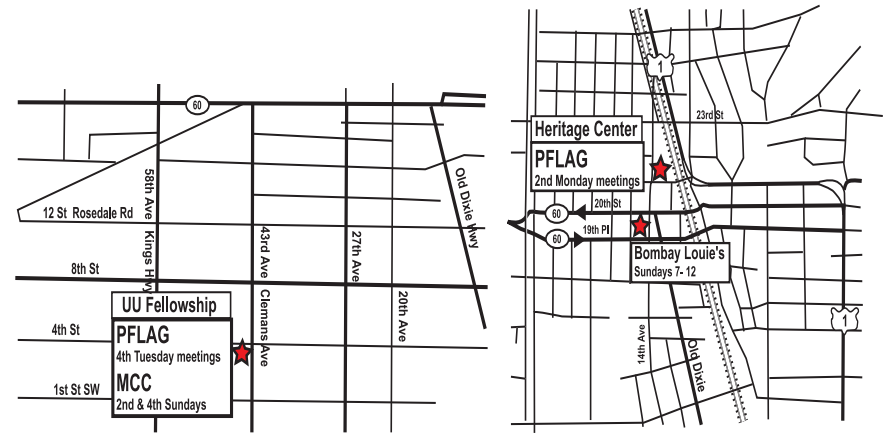
