

What are headaches?

Nearly everyone is familiar with the occasional tension headache, the aching or pounding sensation that can affect most or a part of the head. But there are many different kinds of headaches. For people with a condition called cluster headaches, the pain can become excruciating and recurs in regular cycles, or "clusters."

The brain itself is insensitive to pain, so that is not what hurts when a headache arises. Rather, headache pain is sensed in the following locations:

- The tissues covering the brain.
- The attaching structures at the

base of the brain.

- Muscles and blood vessels around the scalp, face, and neck.

It should be noted, however, that the sources for this pain are in the brain itself or are unknown. Physicians categorize headaches as either primary or secondary, according to their underlying causes.

A cluster headache is a form of primary headache. Treatment varies according to the headache type.

Primary Headaches. A headache is considered primary when a disease or other medical condition does not cause it. Most primary headaches fall into three main types: tension-type, migraine, and cluster headaches.

- Tension headache is the most common primary headache and accounts for 90% of all headaches.
- Neurovascular headaches are the second most frequently occurring primary headaches and include migraines (the more common) and cluster headaches. Such headaches are caused by an interaction between blood vessel and nerve abnormalities.

Headaches are usually caused by either muscle tension, vascular problems, or both. Migraines are vascular in origin, and may be preceded by visual disturbances, loss of peripheral vision, and fatigue. Most headaches can be relieved or ameliorated by over-the-counter pain medications.

It should be noted that symptoms of migraine and tension-type headaches

often overlap and a diagnosis is sometimes difficult.

Secondary Headaches. Secondary headaches are caused by other medical conditions, such as sinus infections, neck injuries, and strokes. About 2% of headaches are secondary to abnormalities or infections in the nasal or sinus passages, and they are commonly referred to as sinus headaches.

Chronic Daily Headaches. The International Headache Society has developed a classification system that includes a category called chronic daily headaches. Chronic daily headaches affect 4% to 5% of the population. They may originate as tension headaches, migraines, or a combination of these or other headache types. Chronic daily headaches are defined as any benign headache that occurs at least 15 days a month and is not associated with a serious neurologic abnormality. Most people with these headaches have them daily or almost daily and they can be quite debilitating. Chronic daily headaches are, in turn, subdivided into two categories:

- Short-duration headaches, or those lasting less than four hours. The most common type of short-acting chronic headaches is cluster headaches.
- Headaches, which last more than four hours. Tension-type headaches are the most common type of long-duration chronic (recurring) headaches and, in fact, the most common type of chronic headaches in general.

Vote '04 A Change tidbit: The following post appeared on the Democratic National Committee's weblog. "Conservative groups confirmed that Karl Rove —their man in the White House — told them that President Bush will support an amendment to the Constitution forbidding gay marriage: Dr. Don Wildmon, chairman of the American Family Association and initiator of the Arlington Group, indicates that President Bush may finally be ready to take a stand against homosexual marriage. The AFA founder reports that White House advisor Karl Rove told the Arlington Group that Bush will be

making an announcement in support of a federal marriage amendment 'before the end of the month.' Rove, he says, indicated the president is waiting for the proper time and setting to make that announcement.

Republicans are already spinning Bush's support for the amendment, saying that he will support a "more moderate" version.

There is nothing moderate about this amendment. Legal scholars from both sides of the political spectrum have testified that this amendment would go far beyond simply taking away the right of states to recognize same-sex marriages.

The second sentence of the measure would also restrict states from providing legal benefits and protections to gay and lesbian families, including the right of same-sex couples to visit one another in the hospital." ▼


