With me graduating from my high school I doubt greatly that my Gay-Straight Alliance (GSA) will continue but it seems that a passing of the ever-burning gay flame will be to the Space Coast High School in Port St. John.

Justin Amos, the soon to be president of a new GSA there, hopes to help the school to grow in homosexual acceptance. To that end he is enlisting the help of major groups like the Gay and Lesbian Student Education Network. One of his major hopes is to allow more interaction between homosexual and heterosexual teens along with disbanding stereotypes. "We have a school slogan for the club and it's, 'what the world needs now is love sweet love", he says with a laugh. To be sure, because the importance of acceptance in our public schools cannot be over stated. "Small terms like fag or queer can be damaging." Justin observed.

Additionally, he plans to contact the National Aids Society to get them to bring a speaker and talk to the student body, both gay and straight, about the importance of safe sex. He is also planning to contact other GSA's and have a large function to help the counties well-being, maybe a picnic or barbecue. He also wants to do basic fundraisers like car washes and bake sales.

Just like when most GSA's are formed, the principal was at first hesitant and believed that it was just because they wanted a fight, to stand and raise their voices. Justin claims it was not, "We just want a place where gays and straights can be understood and safe."





[And I hope Justin and Gabriel contact this magazine so we can be sure to publicize their fundraisers and lend whatever other support we can. – the editor]



- Do you seem to not be at peace with money? Does financial insecurity haunt you?
- Do you feel like you are always on the outside looking in when it comes to relationships in your life? While others seem to have closeness, warmth, and trust in their relationships, do you feel that you don't?
- 3. Do you feel like you have had a long series of bad luck? Does life seem to work for other people but not for you?
- 4. Do you always seem to be at war with someone or something in your life?
- 5. Are there some things and some behaviors that are beginning to get out of bounds in your life?
- 6. Does your life seem like an endless series of damage control maneuvers? Are you so busy patching leaks and steering around barriers that you never seem to have a chance to set a meaningful course for your life?

- 7. Do you always feel vaguely guilty guilty about things you are doing and guilty about things you should be doing, but aren't?
- 8. Is your physical health not quite what it should be? Is the way you are treating yourself and your body beginning to take a toll on you?

It's not easy to be honest with yourself. But honesty is the first step to gaining power over any weakness we find in our lives. We can't fix what we won't admit is broken or in need of repair.

Admitting the issue helps us focus in on what is wrong in our lives, spiritually, financially, emotionally, and physically. God's will is for us to have self-control in our lives.

Second, we need to remember that we have been born into a new life. The life we have in Christ is a powerful life. It doesn't how many weaknesses one discovers in their lives, the power of Christ is stronger than those weaknesses.

Third, we are tested in life to see what we are made of. We experience difficulties and trials to determine where our strengths and weaknesses might be. As each strength and/or weakness is revealed, we have the opportunity to name the problem or the strength. As we name them, we begin to find we have more power to deal with them. When we won't name them, we are failing to recognize that they are present in our world.
