Gay's on the brain of heterosexual Television?? Well thanks to a few determined executives it's happening and it's being led by the already gay friendly Viacom, which brought us "Queer As Folk" (which sadly will be having it's last season soon) and "The L Word," currently in its second season. Viacom is set to launch LoGo, where their slogan is "Different. Together." With LoGo launching on June 30th and here! already on the air it seems like a popular move.

LoGo will be launching their own TV dramas and original shows, "Noah's Ark" will be a Comedy / Drama of a gay African American film write, while other shows like "My Fabulous Gay Wedding" will be a big smash. Along with that Viacom, with Paramount Pictures, has raided their movie vaults and will be showing them on the network

Now the little-known network here!, launched less than a year ago (and now available in some 30 million homes via video on demand, subscription video on demand, pay per view and as a subscription channel on DIRECTV), also has huge shows, including "Third Man Out," about a gay police detective, and "Adored: Diary of a Male Porn Star."

In an interview Paul Colichman, the founder and CEO of here! and partner in Regent Entertainment, said, "Straight people have a stereotypical view of gays: we are either out at bars having anonymous sex or working as a hairstylists or decorators. They don't want to do anything that disrupts the stereotypes. Showing gays in normal relationships or jobs, or as a family with a child, disrupts that." And that's exactly what Mr. Colichman needs to show: that gay life is something that happens just like our heterosexual counter parts.

Both channels will be having mainstream shows like "Queer Eye For The Straight Guy" and "Will and Grace." So buckle up for a wild ride on TV! And call your cable or Satellite provider and be proud to ask for these channels or subscribe to them.

And speaking of pride here's what Colichman had to say on their fundraising: [to promote the network] "we are sponsoring over 50 gay and lesbian film festivals, gay bowling leagues, softball and scuba diving clubs, as well as dozens of gay and lesbian pride parades. We must be the proudest people on earth."





An "Annual Reminder" of Pride

As we approach the annual celebration of Gay Pride Days across the country, it seems an appropriate time to take a look back at how, where, and why these celebrations emerged.

The gay liberation movement started in the mid-1960s and learned much from the Civil Rights Movement. Four organizations - the New York Daughters of Bilitis. and Mattachine chapters from New York City. Washington D.C. and Philadelphia met in Philadelphia in January of 1963 and formed the East Coast Homophile Organizations (ECHO). Following the example of African American college students and Freedom Riders who used direct-action tactics in their struggle against segregated facilities, ECHO decided to take a comparable stand against the institutional structures that encouraged and perpetuated gay and lesbian oppression.

ECHO decided to protest the exclusion of homosexuals from federal employment and the armed services. To do this, the organization decided to picket in front of the Pentagon, The Civil Service Commission, the State Department, and would culminate the series of actions with a picket in front of the White House.

The tenor of the times demanded a strict dress code for all participants. Men had to wear a suit jacket and tie and women had to wear dresses. And American flags had to be carried, by law, at all demonstrations. One of the goals of this early action was to get bystanders to hear the message rather than be prematurely turned off by appearances.

Marching in decorous single file, carrying signs that read **SEXUAL PREFERENCE IS IRRELEVANT TO FEDERAL EMPLOY-**

MENT; CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION IS UN-AMERICAN and wearing their "Equality for Homosexuals" buttons, this intrepid group of demonstrators were the first gay protest to ever be seen in the nation's capital.

The final demonstration in April of 1965 in front of the White House saw more than seventy marchers participating. After this success, Craig Rodwell, an organizer and participant of the series of pickets, was determined that this success would not be the end but rather the beginning. His idea was to demonstrate every Fourth of July in front of Independence Hall in Philadelphia. He wanted to create a gay holiday. He decided to call it the "Annual Reminder". The reminder that a group of United States citizens still didn't have their basic rights to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

Many of the participants in the pickets of April 1965 were so enthused by Craig's idea, that the first Annual Reminder sponsored by the New York, Washington, and Philadelphia Mattachine societies took place that very July, only three months after Craig first offered the idea.

Thirty-nine people picketed in front of Independence Hall from three-thirty to five p.m.. The demonstration was mentioned on the local Philadelphia TV news and on the front page of *The Philadelphia Inguirer*.

For the next five years, a stalwart and tenacious group of from thirty to a hundred people, always including the originator of the idea, Craig Rodwell, would appear with their placards and buttons (*BILL OF RIGHTS FOR HOMOSEXUALS; 15,000,000 HOMO-SEXUAL AMERICANS ASK FOR EQUAL-ITY, OPPORTUNITY, DIGNITY*) in front of independence Hall. This small but mighty band were in the vanguard of earnestly asserting what seemed then like a utopian demand for "gay rights". Those who participated in the Annual Reminders did so with not a little trepidation. They had no way of knowing what the consequences might be. Would their names be printed in the newspapers? Would they loose their jobs? Would they get arrested?

By the time of the second Annual Reminder in 1966, the event attracted the attention of the Bureau of Special Services. Craig Rodwell received a visit one night, at his apartment in New York City, from three men in dark business suits flashing their FBI badges.

The fifth Annual Reminder picket of Independence Hall came two days after the last of the Stonewall riots. Craig Rodwell was still centrally involved in organizing the event. He placed ads in *The Village Voice* to drum up interest. He got fifty recruits, including, this time women who brought along their children. He also received a series of threatening phone calls. The nameless callers warned Craig that the bus he had rented to go to Philadelphia would be followed and capsized with all occupants to be beaten.

When the participants gathered on July 4, 1969 to board the bus a convertible with four white men brandishing baseball bats pulled up and parked across the street. The four men sat there glaring at the group boarding the bus. Craig, though was already ahead of his would-be attackers. He had called the police after the fourth threatening phone call and had police escorts arranged for the bus. But the men in the convertible never followed the bus. In Craig's view it was not the sight of the police that frightened them off, but the presence of women and children that took them by surprise. The men in the convertible had expected to see "just faggots".

The 1969 Annual Reminder in Philadelphia went along as the previous four: the group of some seventy-five people—men in suits and ties, women in dresses, despite the ninety-five-degree weather—walked silently in a circle. An aura of respectability was palpable. But something new was brewing. Many of the participants in the 1969 demonstration were young first-time participants who had been energized by the recent


events of the Stonewall Revolt. On the bus trip back to New York after the event they argued with their elders for a new impetus. They wanted a new departure that would embody the defiant spirit of Stonewall.

As this conversation continued, it became clear to Craig Rodwell that they had just witnessed the final Annual Reminder. A new day was breaking, one that would require different tactics and a different format. The Annual Reminder would move from being a silent plea for rights to an overt, loud, embracing, dynamic demand for rights. The Christopher Street Liberation Day was born. ▼





Gay Rights tidbit: When the United Church of Christ (UCC) wanted to air their ads promoting diversity and acceptance last year, the ads were rejected by CBS and NBC as too controversial leading to many protests to the FCC. At the same time ABC did not run the ads claiming that they do not run religious ads so there was no protest against them. However, ABC has apparently changed their minds. On Monday, May 1, ABC ran an ad for Focus on the Family during "Supernanny." On Focus on the Family's web site they state their mission as "To cooperate with the Holy Spirit in disseminating the Gospel of Jesus Christ to as many people as possible and, specifically to accomplish that objective by helping to preserve traditional values and the institution of the family." Now unless you've been completely unconscious for the past few years you know that "preserve traditional values" is religious right speak for anti-gay, anti-women, anti-equal rights intolerance. So now the religious right has succeeded in suppressing pro-tolerance on all the broadcast networks while using them to spew their hatred. Stand up, fight for our rights!
