



Of course the real salute goes to the people who cared enough to show up and contribute and the business that donated the prizes for the raffles and auctions. This is the money that will get the ball rolling, get the initial t's crossed and i's dotted. Anyone interested in getting involved with the center, just email TheLivingRoom@ootcmag.com. And look for more fundraisers this fall. The goal is \$15,000 to get the doors open and they're off to a great start!

Speaking of new starts, **East Coast MCC** is moving its services in Brevard from UUF (Unitarian Universalist Fellowship) in Melbourne to UCC (United Church of Christ) in Palm Bay. A real thought provoking event is coming up at **Family of God Community Church** in Cocoa. They will be screening the film *Fish Can't Fly*. The film is a truthful look at the tragic effects of ex-gay "therapy" on those who have gone through it. This is timely considering the story last June of Zach Stark, the Tennessee teenager whose parents sent him to Love in Action (a camp where he was to "cured" of his homosexuality). You may remember that Zach's blog (web log/internet diary) about his fears and the resulting publicity effected in his release from the camp and pending charges against Love in Action for lack of a counseling license and investigation of child abuse. *Fish Can't Fly* will be shown at the **Family of God Community Church** at 7 PM on Wednesday, September 14th. For those unfamiliar with ex-gay "therapy" this will be an eye-opener, for sure!

Another eye-opener will be the Nazi Persecution of Homosexuals 1933-1945 exhibit at Compass in West Palm Beach. Compass is proud to be the first gay and lesbian center in the nation entrusted with this traveling exhibit from The United States Holocaust Memorial Museum. This internationally-renowned exhibit will be at Compass from November 13 through January 6. If you don't know the significance of the pink triangle or thought only Jews were persecuted in the holocaust, this exhibit will reveal the horrible truth. Compass is hosting the exhibit in partnership with Florida Atlantic University's Center for Holocaust and Human Rights Education. And if you're a serious bike rider, sign up with Compass for The Smart Ride on November 4th and 5th, then get your friends (or your favorite bar) to sponsor you so you can raise funds as you enjoy the leisurely two-day, 167 mile, bike ride from Miami to Key West. 



One half step backward is the announcement by the organizers of the Florida anti-gay marriage amendment that they are within days of having enough signatures to trigger a review by the Florida Supreme Court. I say half step because they still don't have anywhere enough signatures to get it on the ballot and they have to get it past the Florida Supreme Court, who may have a problem since amendments are supposed to be single issue while this one defines marriage as only being between a man and a woman and prohibits any other kind of legal union being the equivalent of marriage. Keep your fingers crossed on that one. ▼

In Our Past

"A call to me. . . more important than life."

Henry Hay and the Founding of the Mattachine Society

Perhaps as long as there have been human beings, there has existed the desire to come together in groups. World history is filled with examples of people organizing around shared interests and concerns. Lesbian, gay, bi-sexual, and transgendered history is no different. Our history is filled with examples of organizations founded specifically to meet the needs of gay people of all sorts.

Over the next two issues of *Out on the Coast magazine*, this column will explore the history and legacy of two foundational organizations – the Mattachine Society and the Daughters of Bilitis. Each of these organizations played a critical role in creating a foundation of activism on behalf of gay people that current day organizations like the Human Rights Campaign and others carry on. The Mattachine Society and the Daughters of Bilitis remind us that the past is indeed always prologue.

During the 1950s in California it was illegal for two gay men to congregate. Henry "Harry" Hay believed that gay men and lesbian women not only had the right to congregate but that gays and lesbians had a unique viewpoint to offer the world. Over the many years of his activism he would develop a theory he called "gay consciousness". Hay believed that "We [gay people] differ most from heterosexuals in how we perceive the world. That ability to offer insights and solutions is our contribution to humanity, and why our people keep reap-

pearing over the millennia."

In 1948, Harry Hay created a political strategy no one had ever thought of before. He advanced the notion that since homosexuals made up a cultural minority (he was the first to name homosexuals a "minority") that in exchange for ideological support, homosexuals would give their votes. Hay proposed, that if the then Vice-President Henry Wallace, who was running for President in that election year as the Progressive Party's candidate, would back a sexualprivacy law Hay would organize homosexuals to vote for him. Hay planned to call this first organizational conception, "Bachelors Anonymous". Hay wrote and discreetly circulated a prospectus calling for "the androgynous minority" to organize as a political entity. Hav's called for an "international bachelor's fraternal order for peace and social dignity".

Two years later Hay's organizational efforts were successful. On November 11, 1950, at Hay's home in the Silver Lake district of Los Angeles, a group of gay men met and formed the Mattachine Society. With Harry Hay's flair for all things dramatic ((he was an actor who performed on Los Angeles stages with Anthony Quinn in the 1930s and with Will Geer, who became his lover. Geer went on to play the grandfather in the television series "The Waltons.") and his vast knowledge of history, he took the name "Mattachine" from a group of French medieval dancers who appeared publicly only in mask, a device well understood by homosexuals in the 1950s.

Harry Hay used the grassroots organizing skills that he had learned as a member of the Community Party to build the Mattachine Society. He devised a secret "cell" structure similar to the one used by the Communist Party to protect individual gay members of the nascent Society and to build a gay network. The Society quickly grew to include thousands of members in dozens of chapters, which formed from Berkeley to Buffalo.

In 1952, Mattachine successfully defended a gay man who had been entrapped by Los Angeles Police and charged with "led and dissolute conduct." It was one of the first times such charges, which Hay and others came to see as a kind of organized harassment, were thrown out by a California court.

Hay's politics were revolutionary for the time. When it was dangerous to publicly identify as a "homosexual" Harry Hay


was not only out but actively organizing. As often is the case, it turned out that Harry Hay was too radical for the organization he created. By 1954, Hay had been ousted by more conservative members of Mattachine. Harry Hay had a penchant for wearing "the knit cap of a macho longshoreman, a pigtail, and a strand of pearls". He started the Mattachine Society "upon this feeling of idealism, a great transcendent dream of what being Gay was all about." Even after he left the organization, Hay knew the dream would continue.

Harry Hay died on October 24, 2002, at the age of 90. ▼




