

Spiritually Speaking

Four years ago, when Mike and I first moved to the Melbourne area, we purchased a Bird of Paradise plant for the patio of our apartment. For the two years we lived in the apartment, we faithfully watered the plant and watched over it to protect it from any harm. Two years ago, when we purchased our home in Rockledge, we planted it in our front yard. At that time we discovered it was not just one, but three plants in the planter.

Here we are, four years later, and we have finally seen the first blooms on the plant. After four years of waiting, sometimes impatiently, we have four beautiful blooms on the plants.

Those who know me well know that I sometimes have difficulty with the concept of having to wait. When I decide something is the right thing for me, I want it right then and don't want to have to wait for it. It can be a challenge for me to wait for the right time for what I want.

As a child, it was difficult to wait for the magical day of Christmas once Thanksgiving arrived. The end of the school year couldn't come fast enough and vacation trips seemed to never arrive. One of the greatest challenges for me was waiting to turn sixteen and to be able to gain the coveted Driver's License. The year I was fifteen was nothing but pure torment.

Even today, I tend to lean towards the impatient side of things waiting to see my plans come to pass. It seems that when I am impatient, plans take a lot longer time to come to pass. I have accepted a new challenge and am looking at a new major goal for my life. The end result of this new task won't come for between four and five years. One of my greatest concerns is "will I be able to pace myself and follow the prescribed program of my challenge?"

Most of us have difficulty waiting. If we diet,

it seems that the weight doesn't come off fast enough. If we join a gym, the muscles don't seem to develop quickly enough. When we are looking to purchase a house or new car, it is difficult to wait during the contract negotiations, the waiting for an answer on a mortgage or loan, and then waiting for the day the deal closes. It is difficult waiting for an elected official's term of office to expire so that we can have a chance to vote for someone else.

Modern technology has helped us learn how to be impatient. We complain at a restaurant if it takes too long to get our food. We complain if the microwave doesn't cook our food fast enough. If traffic doesn't move fast enough, we become angry and begin to make comments to other drivers. When we call to make an appointment we become agitated if the time we want isn't available.

It's been said that patience is a virtue. The Apostle Paul wrote that having patience is a sign of personal maturity, when someone has reached the place in their lives when they have become productive, producing fruit in their lives.

Like the Bird of Paradise in my yard which took four years to bloom, patience can take time to develop in our lives. Waiting for the fulfillment of a dream can be a real challenge.


For years we have been waiting for equal rights in our community. We patiently wait for the day we can legally have our relationships recognized by the government. We wait for the day when there is no more discrimination against our community.

It took four years for my Bird of Paradise to bloom. Some of us have waited for years to see our dreams realized. Patience comes with maturity, with learning how to wait for the flowers in our lives to bloom.



In Our Past

"Gutsiest cross-dresser of all time"

Proving that trans-gender issues are as old as the Pharaohs, the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City recently concluded an exhibit on Hatshepsut. Hatshepsut can teach us all about not being afraid to dare.

Hatshepsut was married to Thutmose II who died in 1479 B.C.E. Upon his death Hatshepsut became regent for her stepson. It was customary for regents to step aside when the child came of age. Custom seemed to hold no interest for Hatshepsut. She had herself crowned king and ruled alongside the stepson as "senior co-pharaoh." While women could be leaders in ancient Egypt, a pharaoh was male by definition. Definitions and customs were meant to be changed according to Hatshepsut. And she certainly knew the import of what she was doing as once a pharaoh was crowned the move could never be reversed as pharaohs were gods and could not renounce their divinity.

Thutmose III, Hatshepsut's stepson seemed all right with his stepmother's decision. Indeed Hatshepsut's reign was among the most prosperous in Egypt's history. Art and architecture flourished. Peace prevailed. Historians compare her rule with that of Elizabeth I of England.

Yet twenty years after Hatshepsut's death, her stepson, Thutmose III, for inexplicable reasons had all images of her destroyed. Maybe he didn't want other women to get ideas about bending rules about gender in order to lead?

difficult as the exhibit at the Met demonstrated.


The first look at Hatshepsut afforded by the exhibit was in the Met's Great Hall, where a gargantuan sphinx of the gender-bending pharaoh, 11 feet long and carved of granite, looms. Met researchers working with fragments excavated by archeologists pieced together the statue which has a lion's body and a "royal portrait head adorned with the striped head cloth and stylized ceremonial beard worn by kings." Another reconstructed statue also depicts Hatshepsut with the traditional kingly head cloth and beard. A third statue shows Hatshepsut much more informally as a seated feminine Hatshepsut, beardless and clothed in a sleeveless sheath.

Reviewers of the exhibit noted that Hatshepsut was "no Nefertiti", meaning her physical beauty was not her strongest attribute, they also noted that her smile suggests a "confident oneness with divinity." Perhaps that smile also conveyed Hatshepsut's confidence in herself and her life choices. \blacktriangledown






