## In Our Past

#### The possibility of self-support

Like women who entered the teaching profession and ordained ministry in the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries, women who entered medicine faced numerous obstacles and hindrances. Like Jane Addams who created her own profession (see December 2006 *OOTC*), women responded to the opposition by finding niches for their interests and talents. One strategy was to enter specialties that the tenor of the times thought was appropriate as "women's work" like pediatrics and obstetrics. But women also made great inroads in newly developing fields such as preventive medicine and public health.

Many of the women who left their imprint on these areas of medicine lived in intimate relationships that today we would consider lesbian. Lilian Welsh and Mary Sherwood, a committed couple, practiced medicine together at the Evening Dispensary for Working Women and Girls in Baltimore. Emily Blackwell, younger sister of Elizabeth Blackwell the first woman in the United States to attend medical school and become a physician, lived with Elizabeth Cushier. The two sisters opened a practice together.

Emily Blackwell was a born administrator. After a year, a frustrated year in private practice, she decided to throw her formidable skills and talents after her ultimate dream. She raised the funds for a novel enterprise, a hospital to be called the New York Infirmary for Women and Children. The hospital would rely largely on charity, since it would serve the poor. Its dual purpose would also be to provide female doctors the opportunity to do postgraduate study as there was still almost no place in the U.S. where women medical students could serve an internship and then it would provide employment for these women doctors.

The infirmary opened in May 1857. Through Blackwell's determined effort and fundraising skills, she convinced the state of New York to help subsidize the enterprise and to give it official state blessing. She was able to initiate many innovative programs including a "sanitary visitor" program, under which

a "tenement physician" visited indigent patients in their homes. The program was the first organized attempt to deliver medical/ social services to the needy. This program was also unique in that the first physician appointed to the post was Rebecca Cole, an African-American physician who was one of the first women of color to receive a medical degree in the United States.

Emily and her sister Elizabeth realized that if the infirmary were to be able to continue as a women's institution, they needed to also be in the business of training female doctors. The women formulated plans to apply to the New York State Legislature for a charter that would confer college status on the infirmary. After an interruption of four years due to the Civil War, the Women's Medical College of the New York Infirmary for Women and Children finally opened in 1868. Emily Blackwell's efforts resulted in "the first practical demonstration of the importance of the close association of a medical college with a hospital" - a pairing that became common in the U.S. only after the example of the Women's Medical College of the New York Infirmary.

The taxing professional schedule that Emily Blackwell led did provide her with all of the satisfaction she desired. Her life did not feel complete or full until 1882 when she began what would ultimately be a twenty-eight year committed relationship with Elizabeth Cushier.

Elizabeth Cushier was a graduate of the Women's Medical College. After graduating from the college in 1872 she became an intern and then a resident physician at the infirmary. In addition to her work in obstetrics and gynecology, she developed an interest in histology. Because there was still nowhere in the country that a female doctor could do laboratory research in histology, she went to Zurich, Switzerland, as did so many other lesbian Americans intent on pursuing professional study in the 1870s. After eighteen months of research, she returned to the infirmary and the college.

In 1882, as Cushier reported in a later autobiographical sketch, "she joined her life with Emily Blackwell." The two doctors and Emily's adopted daughter Nannie became a family of three. "We had a delightful home," Cushier wrote, declaring that it brought her "constant interest and delight."

Elizabeth Cushier and Emily Blackwell were able to give each other what was missing in their accomplished lives: a shared life, love and intimacy. "Thus the years happily passed," Cushier concluded in her autobiography, "until in September, 1910, a sad blow came in the death of Dr. Blackwell, making an irreparable break in my life." Emily was eighty-four years old. Cushier survived her for another twenty-two years.




