

Spiritually Speaking

Rabbi Harold Kushner, in his book, Why Bad Things Happen to Good People, says that religion is foremost a way of 'seeing'. I would add to that saying how we perceive God sets the tone how we treat each other and how we either respect or loathe ourselves. As we enter into the holiday seasons, especially Thanksgiving, we are confronted with the concept of being thankful. Many people are grateful for the blessings that come into their lives, but seem only to have a 'speaking relationship' with God when the road is rough. When the good times roll, many are not so apt to have any relationship with God, because the perception is: I only need God when I have problems. That is far from the purpose of religion. God wants a personal relationship with all of us. But, it is dependent upon how we 'see' God: how we understand and experience life as it comes to us.

There is a difference between seeing and really seeing. Our eyes give us sight and our hearts give us perception of observation. In what we see: we sense, we feel, we make opinions, and sometimes we make wrong decisions based upon our perception of something—like the drunken man who staggers into a Catholic church and sits down in a confessional box and says nothing. The bewildered priest coughs to attract his attention, but still the man says nothing. The priest then knocks on the wall three times in a final attempt to get the man to speak. Finally, the drunk replies, "No use knocking, there's no paper in this one either."

Jesus said: "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall *see* God." What kind of God we see is dependent upon our purity of heart. If we see a God who plays the role of a cosmic 'Santa Claus' who answers to our every whim—then our perception of God is very selfish indeed. But, if we are able to envision God as a Sovereign Creator who does not need our opinion or consent to rule the world, then we possess a vision

that is pure; And our motivation to serve this Sovereign Lord will be one from loyalty and love, not from self-centered gratitude or egocentric motives, wants, and wishes. The Sovereignty of God means that God will bless and have mercy upon whom God will, apart from consulting us in the process.

Remember good ol' Job? Job was a man who lost everything-family, wealth, health-and in his extreme suffering and pain he does not curse God, but is obsessed with the 'why' of it all. "Why me, Lord? I am a good person. I don't deserve this..." And in the end Job takes on a sort of self-righteous attitude, as if he were singing the old spiritual: Nobody Knows De Trouble I've Seen...oh please... Many of us at times have these same feelings and questions, as humanity has for thousands of years. The entire book of Job is a poetical treatise concerning the anguish of the innocent, why bad things happen to good people. The answer though, may not be enough for the egotistical, but for the pure in heart it is more than enough.

I've seen some narcissistic people in my time—those who think they are always right, those whose 'business' never stinks, those who cannot get along with others, who cannot respect the opinions or actions of others, who refuse to see the bigger picture, who 'sweat the small stuff' and would rather play trivial head games of control and sarcasm. Those who are obsessed with themselves cannot see God as God is. Their motivation is distorted, and so therefore, their hearts— the very center and core of being and emotion—are impure.

Job had a vision of the Sovereign God and saw that his incessant worrying was really a sign of skepticism and mistrust in the God who is Creator and Ruler of the Universe, the One who has dominion over all. He says to God (Job 42:2, 5-6):

"I know that You can do all things; no plan of Yours can be thwarted...

My ears had heard of You but now my eyes have seen You.

Therefore I despise myself and repent in dust and ashes."

To be 'pure in heart' is not just clean morals. It speaks to the very focus of our faith. Job was a moral person, a righteous person, but that was not enough. His faith had to be transformed, and the suffering and pain he endured was a sort of fiery furnace, to refine his character. To be pure in heart means that our motives are not mixed and our loyalties are not divided. God will use whatever means to refine our character.

Have you ever been talking with someone who smiles and converses, but all the while is looking around at everything else except you and seem preoccupied and not interested in you, but just pretending to be? That is how some people serve God. They go through all the motions but they really don't love God with all their heart, soul, and strength. It is only when we serve our

God from unmixed motives and undivided loyalties that we understand and see God as a Sovereign God, the All-Wise and All-Powerful One who has our best interest in mind.

I have had to learn the lesson of God's Sovereignty over and over, sometimes by very hard lessons. Maybe you are struggling today to give up your right as judge and jury, to learn the way of completely trusting by faith in all God does and allows to come into your life. Today, I challenge you to make changes in yourself, instead of someone else, to make your Creator the Master of your life, and to be a pure participant in God's Dominion.

PETERSBURG-A report in the St Petersburg Times says two wealthy Republicans are fueling both sides in the fight over Amendment 2

Jennifer Liberto, a Times Staff Writer wrote on Thursday, October 16, 2008 that the patriarch who founded Amway Corp is pro-2 and on the other side is a little-known telecom multimillionaire.

According to the story, Donald A. Burns, 45, of West Palm Beach, contributed 18 percent or \$400,000 of the \$2.2-million raised by Florida Red and Blue, the most prominent group fighting Amendment 2.

State records show billionaire Orlando Magic owner Richard DeVos, 82, of Grand Rapids, Mich., has given \$100,000, or about 15 percent of the \$676,700 raised by Florida4Marriage, the group that collected signatures to put Amendment 2 on the Nov. 4 ballot.

[Of course it was the Republican Party of Florida that donated \$300,000 of that amount at the precise time it was needed to keep the effort from failing to get anywhere near enough signatures to qualify - ed.]

Liberto was unable to get a comment from either man.

Florida4Marriage has provided sample sermons for pastors across the state hoping they'll promote Amendment 2 as part of a "Marriage Sunday."

Florida Red and Blue has launched television commercials, while allies have taken to staging news conferences across the state and debuting Web-only videos, including one featuring Michael Schiavo, the widower of Terri Schiavo.

Amendment 2 would define marriage in the state Constitution as between one man and one woman. Florida already has such a state law, but Amendment 2 backers say the law could be overturned, as it was in

Connecticut last week, or the Legislature could change it.

Burns is a relatively new force on the state political scene. A Republican investor and philanthropist, he gave \$500 contributions to Gov. Charlie Crist, Gov. Jeb Bush and Sen. Ken Pruitt.

Last year, he told Florida Red and Blue that he'd match contributions of up to \$250,000. Then he contributed another \$150,000. The group's campaign manager, Derek Newton, declined to talk about Burns, saying he respected his contributors' privacy.

Burns is a former chief executive of publicly traded Telco Communication Group, a discount long-distance service provider. It was sold in 1997 for \$1.2-billion.

In the decade since then, he's launched the Donald A. Burns Foundation, a Palm Beach charitable foundation to "promote educational and social institutions." Tax records show assets of \$10.7-million in 2006.

Burns also owns the New York building where actor Heath Ledger died this year.

The DeVos family, on the other hand, is a familiar name in Florida politics and beyond. It owns the Orlando Magic basketball team. Richard DeVos Jr., the 52-year-old son, ran an unsuccessful campaign for Michigan governor in 2006.

The DeVos family has contributed millions toward conservative causes nationwide. including school voucher, antiabortion and anti-gay marriage efforts.

Over the past 12 years in Florida, both DeVos Sr. and his son have given \$700,000 to Florida Republicans.

In 2004, when Michigan considered and ultimately passed its own gay marriage ban, the DeVos family spent \$125,000, according to the Grand Rapids Press.

This year, DeVos' contribution to the Florida's gay-marriage ban prompted a protest of 30 people outside of Amway Arena, where the Magic play, on Sept. 28, the Orlando Sentinel reported.

Orlando City Commissioner Patty Sheehan, who is gay, called for an investigation on whether DeVos' support of Amendment 2 violates the city's ordinance banning discrimination.

STATEWIDE— Michael Schiavo hasn't lost his fighting spirit!

Schiavo first drew the national spotlight a decade ago, when he began his battle to remove his brain dead wife Terry's feeding tube. Her parents objected, thus sparking a lengthy court battle that putted Schiavo against the nation's right-wing conservatives, including Congress' Republicans, who turned the family matter into a political circus. Michael Schiavo ultimately prevailed.

Well, now he's back and fighting against Florida's Amendment 2, which would constitutionally define marriage as between a man and a woman even though samesex marriage is already prohibited in the Sunshine State. The Amendment reads: "Inasmuch as marriage is the legal union of only one man and one woman as husband and wife, no other legal union that is treated as marriage or the substantial equivalent thereof shall be valid or recognized." Such a measure would also prevent straight and gay domestic partners from gaining marital benefits, an argument that provides the thrust for Schiavo's argument.

Saying he's "troubled" by the Amendment,

Schiavo takes on "the same people who thought they knew what was best for my wife, Terry," who are "once again trying to tell others how to live." He goes on to say it's "hard to respect people who only pay lip service to family values. As a former Republican, I think that if the people behind Amendment 2 really cared about legal marriage between husband and wife, they would have respected mine."

WASHINGTON, DC—The LATimes reported that the Social Security Administration -- not the most controversial of federal agencies unless a monthly check goes missing -- may have stirred up a new round of controversy for the Bush administration in its closing days, in conjunction with the Justice Department.

In a little-noticed move, Social Security lawyers sought a ruling from the Justice Department on this question: Are the offspring of same-sex couples entitled to benefits from a non-biological parent, or are the benefits prevented by the Defense of Marriage Act? Under the law, which drew protesters to the Supreme Court when the Senate passed it in 1996, same-sex couples may not receive federal benefits.

The Washington Post editorial page noticed the ruling that came down from the Justice Department's office of legal counsel: Elijah, the son of a couple identified as Karen and Monique, did indeed have a right to such benefits.

The Post summarized the ruling this way:


