FLORIDA/WASHINGTON, DC—Martin Gill, the plaintiff in the successful legal challenge to Florida's anti-gay adoption ban, will be attended the White House Holiday Reception December 16th. The invitation follows a direct appeal by Equality Florida to the President asking him to spotlight the harm of Florida's anti-gay adoption law which has since been struck down by the courts.

"I know I'm not representing just myself or even just my own children. I will be there on behalf of every child in need of a loving home and all the future families that will be formed because of our victory this year. Thank you for standing with me," said Martin Gill in a note written to supporters across the state.

On September 22nd, Martin and his family, represented by the ACLU, won a unanimous Third District Court of Appeals decision that found Florida's adoption ban unconstitutional. The decision is binding statewide and, for the first time in 33 years, allows gay people to be considered as prospective adoptive parents in Florida.

Earlier in the year, Equality Florida facilitated Martin Gill and his boys' attendance at the Easter Egg Roll on the White House lawn. The picture of the two boys facing the oval office became a powerful emblem in the fight to end the ban. During the White House Pride event in June, Equality Florida's Executive Director Nadine Smith was able to place that picture and a note in President Barack Obama's hand and ask for his help in denouncing antigay adoption law. The President promised to read the note and White House staff followed up on the request.

"We are thrilled that the President made good on his promise by inviting Martin and his partner to the White House," Nadine Smith, executive director of Equality Florida.

"Martin Gill is a hero to the thousands of children in Florida's foster care system who now have a better chance of finding a loving adoptive family," said Smith. "Most of all, Martin is a father who stood up and refused to allow anyone to tear their family apart."

The end of the anti-gay adoption ban, the only such ban in the nation, is evidence of a dramatic shift in Florida. A recent report by Equality Florida shows the majority of Floridians now live in communities with inclusive anti-discrimination policies.

Major employers are also lauding the end of the adoption ban, passage of safe schools laws and pro-equality local ordinances as a major improvement in Florida's reputation as a welcoming and inclusive place to live, work and visit. Through Equality Florida's "Equality Means Business" program, corporations such as Pepsico, Wells Fargo, Citi, and BlueCross BlueShield of Florida are highlighting the importance and value of respecting diversity in Florida.

Equality Florida is the largest civil rights organization dedicated to securing full equality for Florida's lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender community.

WELLINGTON—International Gay Polo Tournament To Benefit Palm Beach County Human Rights Council

The Gay Polo League - the world's only polo league for lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) players - will return to Florida to host their second International Gay Polo Tournament. The event will be held at the Grand Champions Polo Field in Wellington on Saturday, April 1, 2011.

The Gay Polo League is a United States Polo Association (USPA) official club and consists of all levels of polo players, from beginners to professionals. The League will bring out their highest players to compete in a USPA governed tournament, comprised of twelve League players, and four additional worldclass polo professionals.

This year, half of the money raised from ticket sales will be donated to the Palm Beach County Human Rights Council (PBCHRC), a local non-profit organization dedicated to ending discrimination based on sexual orientation, gender identity and gender expression.

After last year's tournament, PBCHRC successfully lobbied the Village of Wellington to amend its Equal Employment Opportunity policy to prohibit discrimination based on sexual orientation, gender identity and gender expression.

"The Gay Polo League's selection of Wellington as the site for an international LGBT event encouraged the Council to ask the Village to adopt a more inclusive employment," said Council President Rand Hoch. "We also took the opportunity to ask Wellington to consider offering domestic partner benefits for Village employees."

PBCHRC continues to work with the Village on domestic partnership issues.

"The Palm Beach County Human Rights Council is honored to be in partnership with the Gay Polo League for this incredible event," said Hoch.

WASHINGTON, D.C.—From National Center for Lesbian Rights (NCLR) Major Federal Income Tax Changes for Same-Sex Couples for 2010 Tax Returns A Special to On the Docket by Karen K. Stogdill, CEBS, EA and Deb Kinney, Esq.

In a major victory for the lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender community, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) announced in May 2010 that it will recognize the community property rights granted by states to same-sex couples in state-registered domestic partnerships, civil unions, and marriages just as it does for opposite-sex married couples. Currently, the states that both legally recognize same-sex couples and grant community property rights are California, Nevada, and Washington. While the IRS did not go so far as to recognize the relationship status, this recognition has many positive consequences. As a result of being able to split community property income, many couples-though not all-will pay less federal income tax. Whether any particular couple will pay less tax depends on their particular circumstances, and some couples may owe more in federal taxes.

The IRS announced that the changes, while mandatory for 2010 tax returns and future

years, can be applied retroactively for 2007, 2008, and 2009 tax returns if desired. Tax practitioners in California, Nevada, and Washington have been busy amending tax returns for legally related same-sex couples with many of them getting considerable tax refunds, anywhere from \$500 per couple to as much as \$20,000 per couple, per year. You should consult with your tax advisor about amending your past returns as soon as possible to see how these changes may affect you. Generally, couples who benefit the most are those where there is a large disparity in their income levels. But there are no hard and fast rules here.

If you file as Head of Household (HOH) you may need to take some specific action before December 31, 2010 in order to preserve your HOH filing status.

While this probably does not apply to same-sex couples whose legal residence is in Florida, the status of couples that were legally married in California, Nevada or Washington is not clear. If you are in that situation and want to explore this IRS ruling you must consult both a legal expert and an IRS expert.

Gay Rights tidbit: Florida now ranks among the top five states in the nation in protecting gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) people from discrimination, according to a report released by the statewide civil rights group Equality Florida. 
