





Spiritually Speaking



My heart is saddened once again in the failure of individual Americans to see the bigger picture. As a nation, we have not fully lived up to decency, tolerance, and the dream of being a 'shining city set on a hill.' The recent Tucson tragedy has brought to the surface the horrible truth that not all Americans see others as Americans with the same civil liberties and dignity. Gunning down innocent people at a public political event in a nation that prides itself as 'free' and 'brave,' that gives the individual many privileges and human rights compared to other societies seems almost incredulous. Partisan rhetoric that pits us against each other politically and religiously is not what America is all about. What happened to respecting each other even after disagreeing on issues or opinions? A true democracy allows for all viewpoints; an absolute monarchy and / or dictatorship allow no such verbalization and free exchange of ideas.

It is enough to hear of extremists in Islamic lands attacking and murdering Christians as they worship on the holy ground of their sanctuary. Such hatred and brutality is a far cry from God's highest expectations for humanity. But in recent years, we have seen Americans rise up against each other and our government; we have witnessed brutal shootings and senseless killing from people taking things into their own hands. The United States of America:

the wealthiest of nations, the strongest world military super-power, and possibly the most liberated society with freedom of religion, speech, and expression. Yet, if we cannot recognize and practice national unity, the foundations will falter one day and as great empires of the past we too shall go the way of slipping into history's oblivion. Martin Luther King Jr. said: "We must learn to live together as brothers or perish together as fools."

As Americans, we are challenged to perceive the collective unity that binds us as one people and yet still find common ground to respect and celebrate our differing and unique cultures, ethnicities, and spiritualities -- even when we peacefully agree to disagree.

Jesus has given social and spiritual principles to guide the nations into becoming that "shining city on a hill." And Jesus does this by turning the expected order of things, surprising and at times disappointing our great aspirations of success and fortune: It is not the powerful. but the meek who shall inherit the earth. It is not the rich, but the poor in spirit who shall possess God's kingdom. The last shall be first and the first shall be last. The hungry are filled and the well-to-do are sent away empty. Jesus turns the table to show that we are all one...regardless of social rank, political party, skin color, sexual orientation, and religious identity. As we see each other as the 'collective whole' then we will not dehumanize each other. We will uphold each other's dignity. If society is fragmented through prejudice, intolerance, and inequality —then the



national fabric will tear even further. Where do we go wrong? It is not as complex as one would think. And yet its simplicity will perhaps confuse some and confound others. We have not lived up to the social and spiritual principles Jesus shared and taught. It is extraordinary to hear American politicians call upon Christianity as its guiding light and yet blatantly ignore the teaching of its Founder concerning many issues we presently face as a society. We have gone wrong in believing only what we want to believe. We have not built American society on unpolluted motives that could have brought that Promised Land or Utopia many early American leaders and pioneers envisioned as they came to this new land.

"We recognize our own mortality, and are reminded that in the fleeting time we have on this earth, what matters is not wealth, or status, or power, or fame - but rather, how well we have loved, and what small part we have played in bettering the lives of others." ~ President Obama in his speech at the Tucson Memorial Service

I believe in an America where we respect everyone and work at giving all the same opportunity in education and job security; that gives affordable health care; that strives to enrich patriotism; that although we are the wealthiest, strongest, and most liberated nation on earth—this does not go to our heads to encourage greed or arrogance. America is great only because its people practice decency and fairness, not because our riches account for 25% of the world economy despite the fact we are only 5% of the world population. If we spent less on bombs, guns, and weapons and put into practice Jesus' teaching on non-violence and love for all (even our enemies), then we could invest more money in bridging the disparaging (and embarrassing) gap between the 'haves' and the 'have-nots.' I believe in an America where family values are truly lived out, not just used as a political platform. I believe in our personal freedoms; but draw a line when Hollywood movies and television present violence, murder, corruption, sexual sleaze, and more as daily entertainment to numb senses and morals. Jesus' concern for the right of women and children needs to be our concern especially as we reflect upon easy divorce and abortion on demand. In the world Jesus is calling us to - the rich do not get richer and the poor get poorer. It is a place of justice, fair dealing, and genuine integrity in the market place and in the town square. I believe in the grand possibility of this experiment called 'America' to work. But, it takes each of us to realize that dream. May it be so...

TALLAHASSEE—According to a report from Florida Together, newly elected Governor Rick Scott, addressing reporters about his appointee as Director of Children and Families, said, "Adoption should be by a married couple."

This statement, in opposition to the recent court decision holding the state ban on gay adoptions unconstitutional, follows the appointment of David Wilkins as Secretary of the Department of Children and Families – the state agency responsible for implementing adoptions in Florida. David Wilkins serves as Finance Chairman for Florida Baptist Children's Homes - an "organization dedicated to providing Christ-centered services to children and families..."

Adoption through Florida Baptist Children's Homes, "require that you be a professing Christian, be active in a local Christian church, and follow a lifestyle that is consistent with the Christian faith."

Florida Together concludes that, "In real terms it means the showdown on adoption may be just starting instead of nearing an end."

ACLU of Florida (who filed and won the court case allowing gay and lesbian adoption in Florida) has called a series of meetings around the state to prepare for the next steps to defend and protect the ruling from the attacks that are now sure to come.

In Brevard County there will be two events. co-sponsored by PFLAG Melbourne, this magazine, The Living Rom of Brevard and other community organizations. There will be a town hall style meeting on Friday, February 18, 7 to 8:30 PM, and a training session on Saturday, February 19, 1 to 4 PM, facilitated by GLAAD. Both events will be held at Riviera United Church of Christ, 451 Riviera Dr, Palm Bav. FL.

MIAMI - January 18 new federal regulations went into effect that require virtually every hospital in the nation to permit patients to designate visitors of their choosing and prohibit discrimination in visitation based sexual orientation and gender identity, among other factors.

The change in regulations came about as a direct result of a tragedy that occurred right here in Florida. Janice Langbehn, Lisa Pond and their children were in Miami for an R Family Vacations cruise when Lisa suffered a severe stroke. Janice and the couple's legally adopted children were denied visitation for more than eight hours while Lisa lay dying.

Equality Florida helped lead a coalition of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) organizations to successfully change policies at Miami's Jackson Memorial Hospital. The year-long effort resulted in Jackson Memorial implementing one of the most pro-LGBT nondiscrimination policies in the nation, including a visitation policy that updates the definition of family to include same-sex partners and other people who may not be legally related to a patient.

"Janice has shown great courage and tenacity by turning her tragedy into a successful effort to ensure LGBT families are respected in virtually every hospital in the nation," said Stratton Pollitzer, deputy director for Equality Florida. "A trip to the hospital is often one of the most frightening and anxious moments a family will ever face. These new regulations ensure that our closest family members can be at our side when we need them most."

Once made aware of Janice's experience, President Obama reached out to Janice and assured her that he would take action. In April of last year, the President issued a memorandum directing the Department of Health and Human Services to develop regulations protecting a hospital patient's visitation rights.

Protecting LGBT families when they are most vulnerable has long been a part of Equality Florida's work. Brian Winfield, communications director for Equality Florida, serves as Diversity Advisory Board Chair for Moffitt Cancer Center, helping ensure LGBT

Floridians have equal access to healthcare provided in a welcoming, non-discriminatory environment.

Equality Florida is the largest civil rights organization dedicated to securing full equality for Florida's lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender community.

CUPERTINO, CA-Queerty.com reports that Apple COO, Tim Cook, will be taking over while CEO Steve Jobs is on medical leave. According to the report Cook is gay and is described by Gawker as "a workaholic who begins emailing his underlings at 4:30 am each morning and eschews Apple's famously good cafes for an endless series of energy bars, which he'll often devour during meetings. The COO prides himself on being the first into the office and the last one out."

SAN FRANCISCO-According to news reports a federal judge has rules that state employees in California can sue for discrimination over the federal government's excluding their same-sex spouse's coverage in long-term health care.

Reports indicate that U.S. District Judge Claudia Wilkin turned down an administration request that the suit challenging exclusion based on the federal Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA) be dismissed.

ON CABLE TV: TNT'S DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. DAY NBA DOUBLE HEADER-former NBA MVP Charles Barkley. responding to a clip of Dr. King's daughter the Rev. Bernice King, spoke about gay rights, "We have a thing going on now - people discriminating against homosexuality in this country. I love the homosexual people. God bless the gay people. They are great people. [Dr. King, Jr.] talked about equality for every man, every woman." Mr. Barkley works with Turner Network Television (TNT) as a commentator for its coverage of NBA games.

ON LINE-The Daily Beast has ranked the states by tolerance. Scores were determined by the number of hate crimes according to the FBI, the extent of hate-crime statutes, the number of complaints of discrimination filed through the Office of Fair Housing and Equal Opportunity, the extent of fair-housing and fairworkplace laws, the percentage of residents that support same-sex marriage, the extent of legal rights for same-sex couples, and the percentage of residents that are accepting

of various religions. Each state was given a score out of 100 points. Ties were broken based on hate-crime statistics-if the total points matched, the state with fewer hate crimes in the last year ranked higher.

Chaffee, an Episcopalian, reportedly stated, "Our foundation here in Rhode Island was built on tolerance and acceptance, and this is an area I want to move our state forward on, by building on our strengths of centuries ago. Let's give marriage equality a chance to grow our state."

A bill to legalize same-sex marriage has been introduced in the Rhode Island House.

WASHINGTON, DC-The United States Supreme Court has declined, without comment, to hear a challenge of the decision of the Washington, DC. Board of Elections and Ethics not to allow a public referendum on same-sex marriage. Bishop Harry Jackson, Senior Pastor of Hope Christian Church, had sued to allow a public vote to overturn the City Council's decision to legalize same-sex marriage.

WASHINGTON, DC-Proud Parenting.com reported that Secretary of State Hillary Rodham Clinton has ordered the State Department to change wording on passports; "mother" and "father" will be removed from U.S. passport applications and replaced with "mother or parent 1" and "father or parent 2", the Department says. An explanation on the State Department website noted: "These improvements are being made to provide a gender neutral description of a child's parents and in recognition of different types of families." The State Department said the gender-neutral passport applications will be rolled out in February.

"Changing the term mother and father to the more global term of parent allows many different types of families to be able to go and apply for a passport for their child without feeling like the government doesn't recognize their family," said Jennifer Chrisler, executive director of Family Equality Council.

FEClobbiedthegovernmentforseveralyearsto remove the words from passport applications.

"Our government needs to recognize that the family structure is changing," Chrisler said. "The best thing that we can do is support people who are raising kids in loving, stable families."

Gay Rights tidbit: At the request of the Palm Beach County Human Rights Council, Michael McAuliffe, State Attorney for the Fifteenth Judicial Circuit of Florida, has revised his policies to allow employees to use family medical leave to care for domestic partners with serious health conditions. Previously, the policy was limited to employees' spouses, parents and children. McAuliffe also updated his policies to prohibit harassment based on gender identity and expression. The prior policy included race, religious creed, color, national origin or ancestry, physical or mental disability, medical condition, marital status, age, sexual orientation and genetic information.

"As State Attorney, I am committed to creating a work place that can bring out our employees" best abilities and potential. That means no barriers based on sexual orientation," said McAuliffe. "By making sure my policies reflect that reality. I want to send the message gay and lesbian members of the state attorney's office can, and must, be welcome as full members of the team."

McAuliffe has informed the Council that he will advocate at the Florida Prosecuting Attorneys


